1. Speeding traffic - A6

At a recent meeting with Borough Highways officers, I raised the issue of speeding traffic along the A6. Officers showed me a record of reported accidents along the stretch outside Wixams and agreed that action is needed. A feasibility study is currently taking place to decide what action can be taken to reduce speeding and improve traffic safety.

2. Parking and drop off outside Wixams Academy

After discussions with both the Borough and Gallagher to try and avoid parking problems when the new Academy opens next September, no site has yet been identified where a drop of zone could be located. One option under discussion is putting in place the road link to the B530, so that traffic can also approach from the other side of Wixams, rather than all traffic arriving via Green Lane. I will keep pushing for a solution to the parking / drop-off issue.

3. Construction starts on new care homes

Residents will have noticed that work has started on the new care home planned for the area above The Causeway, near the lakes. I know some residents have questioned this and whilst I share the disappointment at the loss of green space, development on this site was always in the Wixams Masterplan from the start. This part of Wixams currently lies in Elstow Parish and I have requested that it is transferred to Wixams Parish as part of the Community Governance Review.
