Meltdown in criminal justice cont.

Excerpts from oral report by Kathryn Holloway, Bedfordshire PCC

"Bedfordshire Police has made £34.7 million worth of cuts and if I tell you that our overall annual revenue is £102 million, you will see that that is about a third of the annual revenue of the police force."

"If things remain unchanged - and I have had no guarantee whatsoever that they will not be unchanged - we face £11.4 million to £12.5 million more of cuts within the next four years."

"I do not see how Bedfordshire can be policed safely with fewer [police] and, bearing in mind that it has had a footprint in every single one of the London terror attacks this summer, nor can the capital be protected ..."

"I have no appetite whatsoever, as the PCC for Bedfordshire, in seeing my county become the retail theft capital for the UK." "Why it [neighbourhood policing] is important is that we discovered ... what is in effect a lost generation of children being brought up in households where there is jihadist material and so on. They were unknown to police, education, social services and health."

care to suit this season. 1) Use a gentle cleanser AM and PM




in lukewarm water, not in the hot shower.

Reporting to Wixams - December 2017

A significant number of big planning applications have been on the cards recently. After the application by Barratt Homes for the start of Village 2, and a development of 187 new homes in village 4, near the Ampthill Road, at the time of writing there is now a live application from Aldi for the construction of a large retail depot at Wixams Northern Expansion Zone.

I have already had a number of discussions with Council officers about this application. Whilst it is likely to generate over 500 new jobs at the depot (and makes case for Wixams Station even more compelling) it will also bring significant additional traffic flow to the area. I have proposed that vehicles arriving at the depot should come from the north, beyond the bus gate close to the aggregates depot, rather than via The Causeway, which would bring noise and pollution to those living nearby.

Additionally, at a recent meeting of the Wixams Joint Development Committee, plans were approved for Barratt Homes to construct a 330m link road from the proposed village 2 development over towards the site for villages 3 and 4, towards the Ampthill Road. The sooner we can have a full link up to the B530, the sooner we can start to relieve some of the traffic pressure from schools and construction vehicles that has recently increased quite noticeably.

Whenever these big planning applications are up for approval, I would encourage residents to have their say and respond to the Borough Council with their comments. It is vital that your voice is heard.


