#### Cllr Graeme Coombes - Report Feb 2019 East West Rail

I recently met the Mayor to discuss East West Rail and its implications for Wixams Station. You may be aware there is currently a consultation taking place on 5 different route options through Bedford. Three of these



consider a southern route which would involve a 'crossover' station, away from the town centre, but not necessarily at Wixams. I have told the Mayor I will favour whichever route is best for Wixams and most likely to ensure the station is delivered as promised. Continued on page 3



#### 2019 Budget/Precept setting

The Parish Council has increased the precept from £40,700 to £49,800 to provide for a sharp increase in the number of people living in Wixams, the provision of mobile security, and an increase in the amount of grant funding available for local voluntary groups.

We also need to plan forwards to another expected increase in the population of Wixams. As the precept has increased in-line with the increase in properties, it will only show as a minor change to each household's tax bill.

#### Average speed cameras



The Parish Council has approached the Borough Council with an interest in having average speed cameras installed on Green

Lane and Bedford Road. The Parish Council will look to allocate funding from savings towards the cameras, to expedite the installation, and is currently deciding on a suitable figure. This is based on the results of a recent speed check by Beds Police.

#### May 2019 elections

Every four years elections are held so that you can choose your parish councillors. The next elections are in May this year. If there are fewer applicants than positions then it's unlikely a vote will happen and the present councillors will stay in their roles. If you are interested in becoming a councillor then please email the Clerk. Meetings are once a month and occur in the evening.

Mobile security patrols



During the month of December we piloted the use of mobile security patrols around Wixams. Cannons Guard Security carried out the patrols and gave patrol reports back to the council. We have agreed with Cannons Guard that they will patrol again during February and the council has budgeted for their use during other months.



#### Grants

A reminder: We have extended our grant funding from £5,000 to £10,000 each year to fund local groups. To apply for a grant you must be a charity, community group or local voluntary organisation with a dedicated bank account, operating or providing a service to the community of Wixams. The Council defines a voluntary group as a not-for-profit organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee. Grants can be offered on a one-off basis to support a particular project or the purchase of equipment, to new groups wishing to start up, or as a contribution towards running costs. 

You can find out more about East West Rail at: www.eastwestrail.org.uk I am currently trying to arrange for the consultants for Wixams station to make a presentation at Lakeview Village Hall, that residents can attend and ask questions.

#### Speeding Traffic from the MUGA

Residents have been in touch recently about speeding traffic leaving the MUGA along Harrier Leys and into Green Lane, which has led to a number of 'altercations' between drivers and residents. There are currently no proper junction lines in Harrier Leys, an unadopted road. I raised this with the Borough Council and Gallagher have agreed, in advance of its adoption, to paint white lines at the junctions in Harrier Leys with the MUGA and with Green Lane, which means drivers exiting the MUGA car park have to stop and give way.

Additionally, people need to be aware that they shouldn't park right on top of the junction between Green Lane and Harrier Leys. The Highway Code states that drivers should not park within 10m/32ft of a junction or on a bend. Drivers need to respect these rules and be considerate of other road users, pedestrians and residents around Wixams.




