StreetWatch volunteers needed!



"LOOK, LISTEN and REPORT"

Juliet Wright the StreetWatch Scheme Coordinator for Bedfordshire Police attended the January council meeting to provide details of how the StreetWatch scheme works.

StreetWatch patrols are run by local residents, with the support of the police, to promote good citizenship and to support the community.

StreetWatch is about going for a walk in areas where crime and anti-social behaviour has been identified, getting to know people, and building up the sense of a community spirit. The physical presence of volunteers acts to deter crime and anti-social behaviour.

Training is very simple and will be provided. Volunteers commit to 2 hours a month to patrol in a group, wearing the high-vis jackets provided. Each patrol is registered with Force Control: what time and where you are going. It's entirely your choice where you want to go; you can even take the dog for a walk. After the patrol you feed back to Force Control anything they need to be aware of and to confirm you have finished the patrol. Precept 2020/21

The council has approved an increase to the precept (tax levy for the parish council) in-line with the increase in the number of Band D properties in Wixams. This corresponds to an increase in total precept from £49,830 to £60,800. Individual properties should see no increase in their tax towards the parish council. A band D household's individual tax bill should therefore remain at £42.14 per year. The increase will cover the costs for the implementation of new CCTV and Speed Feedback Signs.

You will no doubt be aware of a planning application for three warehouse-style employment units for the land north of Watson Road (19/02724/MAR). The Parish Council has objected to this application on a number of grounds:

- The overbearing impact and intrusion on privacy, noise and impact on green spaces,
- Traffic and road condition,
- Road safety and
- Requests consideration of broader employment opportunities.

Reporting to Wixams February 2020

**G-Park Warehouse Development
– Land North of Watson Road**

Along with other Wixams residents, I have sent in my comments opposing G-Park warehouse development. When the B&M and Aldi depots were considered, they were on land meant for housing. The Borough Council therefore agreed to change the area by Watson Road from employment use to housing instead, to offset the potential loss of 1000 houses. The Council failed both to follow up on this promise and to find an alternative route for vehicle access, as I had requested them to do. I have now insisted this application be decided by Planning Committee in public, rather than by Planning Officers behind closed doors.

Potholes - Considerable damage has been done to the roads around Wixams by lorries entering from the A6 to travel to existing warehouse depots. The Causeway and Bedford Road are full of cracks and parts of the roads resemble the surface of the Moon. I have reported this to the Borough Highways team, who have been out and patched things up, but I have requested they return and do a proper resurfacing job and remark the white lines around the road junctions.

Wixams Station – East West Rail - The route chosen for East West Rail has been announced and trains on the new line from Oxford to Cambridge will travel through Bedford town centre. This is good news for Wixams, as it means that Wixams Station will be a standalone project on the north/south Midland Mainline, rather than a crossover station incorporating East West Rail, which would have delayed delivery of the station until the end of the decade. As things stand, Borough Council officers advise me we are on track for delivering Wixams Station by 2024.


