



### Wixams Parish Council cont.

Major Planning Applications – Aldi and B&M Stores – Wixams Northern Expansion Zone

Cllr Coombes has been in discussion with Planning Officers regarding these two major applications. These proposals will bring with them significant job opportunities, but also have the potential to create traffic chaos for those living at the northern end of Wixams.

He has made a number of proposals for redirecting traffic to the site away from residential areas and to build buffer zones between the sites and residential areas, to alleviate traffic noise. He will continue to press for consideration of local residents if these plans are to be given the go ahead.

#### Elstow/Wixams underpass

The lighting in the underpass beneath the A6 has been requested for repairs. This underpass is used regularly by pupils attending the Wixams Academy, amongst others, so keeping it well lit is important, particularly during darker nights. Cllr Coombes has been in discussion with Borough officers and others trying to get the repairs made.

#### East West Rail line

The Chancellor's Budget backed key infrastructure schemes which will benefit Bedford. It was announced that the western section of the East West Rail line from Oxford to Bedford will be running by 2024. A new 'East West Rail Company' is also being established to accelerate delivery of the next part of the line from Bedford to Cambridge.



For many years brickmaking was an important part of our local industry. Records of brickworks in the village go back to the nineteenth century. Local farmer Charles Hebbes opened up two in what we now know as the Wixams. They were operated by him and his son.

1. Brickworks south of Dane Lane. The pit has recently been remodelled and is now known as Dane Lane Lake. It opened in 1886.

2. Brickfield on the east of the old Bedford Road, also remodelled and now known as the Lakeview Lake. It opened in 1876.

The bricks were mainly yellow in colour although several shades of red were also produced, sometimes a mixture of the two. With house building in decline both pits closed in the period 1914-16.

There are a number of houses built with the Hebbes bricks in Wilstead, the finest example being the house that Charles Senior built for himself in Bedford Road on the corner of Southern Cross. The village signs at the three entrances to Wilstead are constructed with reclaimed Wilstead bricks.

It is good to know that in spite of redevelopment the pits have been retained to offer us a useful recreation facility. Barry Huckle

Reporting to Wixams - January 2018

ighting along the A6 between Wilstead and Wixams

I have again raised the issue of poor lighting along the A6, where a large number of street lamps have been out of action for some time. I have now been informed that the Borough Council is in the process of procuring materials to upgrade the lighting as part of the Borough wide LED replacements works. Traffic Management is required and works will be carried out at night. The Borough is currently programming this for February. **Parking outside Lakeview School, Wixams** 

Despite considerable delay, after the parking restrictions were initially promised for September, I have now had it confirmed by Borough Council Officers that the traffic restrictions will be put in place during the spring, as the Council informs me that lines can't be painted on roads during wet or cold weather.

A notice to the traffic regulation should be published in January 2018 and I would encourage parents and residents to write to the Borough and make their views known, to show the strength of local feeling about this matter.

In addition, the Borough has allocated  $\pounds 250k$  to a scheme to put enforcement cameras outside schools and I have requested that Lakeview is included in this scheme once the parking restrictions are in place.

#### Wixams access from B530

This is now a step further ahead, after a recent meeting of the Wixams Joint Development Committee which approved plans for a 330m stretch of road to be built by Barratt Homes from their Village 2 site to link up with development in Villages 3 & 4.


