Action Fraud has experienced an increase in the reporting of malicious calls, voicemails, text messages or emails to members of the public purporting to be from HMRC.

The fraudsters state that as a result of their non-payment of tax or other duty, the victim is liable to prosecution or other legal proceedings such as repossession of belongings to settle the balance but can avoid this by arranging for payment to be made immediately by method such as bank transfer or by iTunes gift cards.

- Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information.
- Instead, contact the company directly using trusted methods such as a known email address or phone number.
- Listen to your instincts. If something feels wrong then it is usually right to question it.
- Don't be pressured into making a decision.

Precept

Although final approval has not yet been given (vote to be held in the January meeting), it is likely that the precept will rise this year from £40,735 to £50,000 to provide for a sharp increase in the number of people living in Wixams, the provision of mobile security, and an increase in the amount of grant funding available for local voluntary groups.

We also need to plan forwards to another expected increase in the population of Wixams.

Mobile security patrols and CCTV

During the month of December we piloted the use of mobile security patrols around Wixams. Cannons Guard Security carried out the patrols and gave patrol reports back to the council. It is likely that the patrols will mainly take place during the summer months, when they are most needed.

We are still in the final stages of receiving quotes for improvements to the CCTV; we have now taken four CCTV companies on a tour around Wixams, but have struggled to get the quotes through afterwards... we are now fairly close to finalising this.

Thank you to Councillor Caroline Johnson

Caroline is unfortunately leaving the council as she's moving away from the area. The councillors wish to express their thanks for all her hard work and diligence, especially around the area of the Parish Action Plan/Public Open Forum.

Councillor vacancy

Due to Caroline's resignation, we have an open position on the council. Council meetings are monthly. The councillor positions are unpaid, but if you're interested in the inner workings of Wixams then you will find the role enlightening and you have the opportunity to steer the focus and progress of the parish council.

May 2019 elections

Every four years elections are held so that you can choose your parish councillors. The next elections are in May this year. If there are fewer applicants than positions (as is currently the case) then it's unlikely a vote will happen and the present councillors will stay in their roles. We await full details of the election from the Borough Council, who manage the process.

Grants

A reminder: We have extended our grant funding from £5,000 to £10,000 each year to fund local groups. To apply for a grant you must be a charity, community group or local voluntary organisation with a dedicated bank account, operating or providing a service to the community of Wixams. The Council defines a voluntary group as a not-for-profit organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee.

Grants can be offered on a one-off basis to support a particular project or the purchase of equipment, to new groups wishing to start up, or as a contribution towards running costs. Please contact the Clerk for further details.


Entrance walls/planters

We received the required three quotes for the planters/walls at the two entrances to Wixams and are in the process of agreeing the exact locations with the landowners. These will be the same style as the ones you see at the entrances to Wilstead. We have not yet chosen which of the three contractors will carry out the work.

Reported crime

Crimes reported in Wixams

A 'glitch in the system' means that this month we cannot identify the street/village for reported crimes in the area 'Eastcotts and Wilstead 709', which is the area that includes Wixams.



The crime report is provided by Bedfordshire Police with volunteer help from Bedford & District Neighbourhood Watch.

CCTV is in operation in the Wixams. Bedfordshire Police, in collaboration with Wixams Parish Council, are able to view footage if crimes have been committed. Note: the Police need a location and a time





Councillor GRAEME COOMBES Reporting to Wixams January 2019

irst of all a very Happy New Year to all Wixams residents. As we turn the page on 2018 and look forward to 2019, the growth of Wixams looks set to continue, as village 2 is moving forward and new roads are being put in place to connect us with the communities in villages 3 and 4, towards the B530 and Stewartby.

I have recently given some thought to the current lack of a town centre at Wixams. On a recent visit to Great Denham, another new development site similar to Wixams, I noticed how their town centre has become a focal point for their town, with a post office, health centre, café, off-licence, supermarket and a small community of shops (with plenty of parking!) at the heart of the development.

Whilst it has always been intended that Wixams should also have a town centre – the Wixams Master Plan clearly states "there will be a town centre" – it has been a long time coming. This is yet one more thing to add to the long delayed station and lack of a promised local health centre.

Whilst each of the 4 Wixams villages is meant to have its own local facilities, the town centre would provide Wixams with the ability to make this a much more sustainable community, with GP services and other facilities available locally, rather than having to travel distances.

Developers and planners need to up their game and give details of how the town centre will look and when we can expect it to take shape.




