# Are Wixams residents about to choke on diesel fumes?

The beautiful Wixams garden villages era may be about to finish.

Everyone expects building a new town is going to generate dust. However we know that there is a day when building will finish.

But the massive new B&M warehouse that we can all see on the skyline have just put in an application to use 130 vehicles and 450 trailers. And, with the growth in the size of the commercial expansion zone, that is just the start! Unless an alternative route is found, all these diesel trucks and trailers will be filling up the Causeway, the 'harbour' area and the Retirement village with noise, fumes and heavy traffic.

#### **Annual Parish meeting**

In May we held the Annual Parish meeting (your meeting) and our Annual Parish Council meeting. The council would like to thank those who attended these meetings. The Chairman's Annual Statement was presented as below.

#### May 2019 elections

May was the end of a four-year term of office for councillors. Democratic Services at the Borough Council confirmed the election for Parish Councillors was uncontested. This means there was no election for Parish Councillors on 2nd May as we had fewer applicants than positions (7 out of 15).

The councillors remaining for the next four-year term of office are Chairman Tony Pedder, Charlotte Day, Saqhib Ali, Graeme Coombes, Samantha Mardel, Tracey Flower and Janine Alli-Balogun. Ashley Carr was coopted at the May meeting. We were sad that Laetitia Gamble and Chris Martin chose not to stand as councillors again and we thank them for the time they invested in

the council.

#### Allotments

The Lakeview Allotment Association (LAA) are now very well established and continue to provide good support to their members. The LAA have this year secured funding from the Parish Council to fund equipment purchases, annual equipment maintenance costs on equipment previously purchased by the Parish Council, installation of security gates and other security items. Anyone interested in acquiring a plot should contact the Parish Clerk to be added to a short waiting list.

#### **Grants**

Our Grants Committee was delighted to award a £1200 grant to Wixams 1st Scouts to cover camping equipment costs and £1100 to Lakeview Primary School PTA to cover the costs of 3 school laptops. We have increased our grant funding to a total of £10,000 each year to fund local groups. This can include spend on capital projects or a smaller amount to cover running costs. #### Silent Soldier

In November we installed the Silent Soldier silhouette in the centre of Wixams and at Wixams Academy. The Bedfordshire Royal British Legion 'Silent Soldier' marks the sacrifice of those who fell in the four years of war leading up to the Armistice in November 1918.

#### **Planning**

The Planning Committee has, as in previous years, had a large number of applications to consider this year. They have ranged from loft conversions, extensions and conservatories to larger developments such as Village 2, strategic infrastructure works and the erection of an 80-bedroom care home. If you have any comments regarding proposed applications, do contact the Clerk who will be able to advise the Planning Committee accordingly as your views will be taken into account.

#### **CCTV & Mobile Security Patrols**

Currently the system consists of high definition cameras on the two road entrances/exits that serve Wixams, namely Southern Cross on the South side and Bedford Road between Brooklands Avenue and The Causeway to the North.

The Parish Council has approved the purchase of additional cameras to improve this setup and will expand the network of cameras as Wixams grows.

The Council also initiated the use of mobile security patrols around Wixams towards the end of 2018. Cannons Guard Security carry out the patrols and give patrol reports back to the council. It's early days, but the patrols appear to be effective at disrupting anti-social and criminal behaviour and in providing intelligence that can be used by Beds Police.

#### Wixams Parish Council cont.

#### Average speed cameras

The Parish Council approached the Borough Council in 2018 with an interest in having average speed cameras installed on Green Lane and Bedford Road. The Parish Council has pledged funding of £15k from savings towards the cameras, to expedite the installation. Borough Highways have already added us to the waiting list for the cameras for when the next pot of Borough funding is allocated. This action is based on the results from the speed recording data boxes that were placed by the police on Bedford Road in September 2018, which evidenced a speed problem.

#### Street Ranger & Annual Litterpick

The council recruited a Street Ranger to litterpick throughout the parish and she's been with us for over a year now,

carrying out a great job. In March of this year we had, in conjunction with Neighbourhood Watch and other organisations, a very successful village litterpick once again.

#### 2019 Budget/Precept setting

The council this year increased the precept from £40,700 to £49,800 to provide for a sharp increase in the number of people living in Wixams, the provision of mobile security, and an increase in the amount of grant funding available for local voluntary groups, as mentioned above. We also need to plan forwards to another expected increase in the population of Wixams.

As the precept has increased in-line with the increase in properties, it shows only as a minor change to each household's tax bill.

#### Councillor GRAEME COOMBES

Reporting to Wixams June 2019

This month there was an application made for a Goods Vehicle Operator Licence by B&M Stores for 130 vehicles and 450 trailers at their new depot in the Wixams Northern Expansion Zone.

Although I recognise that the Northern Expansion Zone was always going to result in commercial use, I have for some time expressed concern about large numbers of commercial vehicles entering Wixams via The Causeway and believe this will cause considerable disturbance to people living at the northern end of Wixams, around the roads off Brooklands Avenue facing towards the lake, as well as for those moving into the new ExtraCare home.

I contacted the Transport Commissioner's office, who are responsible for granting licences. They advised me that B&M already hold an operator's licence for 30 vehicles and 32 trailers at their Northampton Depot and this is an extension of that licence to cover their new depot at Wixams.

I have therefore submitted a formal objection to the licence application and will again raise the issue of commercial vehicle access with the Bedford Borough Highways team. The 2 depots planned for the Wixams Expansion Zone should bring job opportunities, but we don't want the quality of life for local residents worsened by endless streams of commercial traffic adding to the traffic problems we already experience at Wixams.

The Borough Highways team therefore need to find an alternative route for all the expected extra traffic.


