Message from Beds Police



Following a spike in vehicle crime we're urging residents to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity. Such thieves are opportunistic, 10 seconds is all it takes to break into a car. So be alert and please take steps to keep your belongings safe.

Here are some simple steps the public can take to minimise their chances of becoming a victim of car crime:

 Always remember to LOCK your vehicle, so many thefts occur from unlocked motors and close the windows and sunroof.

- Don't leave things on show in your car, whether it's an expensive laptop or just some loose change or a packet of cigarettes, as these can be an incentive to the opportunist thief. Even items of clothing can attract thieves, as they may think that there will be money in the pockets.
- Satnavs are currently being targeted keep them out of sight, remove the cradle and wipe away the sucker mark on the windscreen.
- At home, don't keep your **car keys** next to your front door or in an obvious place.

Crime in the Wixams

In the last two months there has been a lot of theft from vehicles and criminal damage to cars. See the crime figures on page two, which show a 300% increase from the three or four crimes that are normally reported. The recent discussion on 23 April on facebook.com/spottedwixams highlighted this spate of crime.

- It is important that all crime is reported by phoning 101. This helps the Police plan a response.
- Scarce Police resources will be targeted at the worst crime area, so reporting crime matters.
- As the previous Police Commissioner pointed out, Bedfordshire Police is only funded as a rural shire, yet has to counter terrorism at a London airport and a high level of crime in the Luton urban area. It's not their fault they are not funded properly.
- Beds Police are recruiting Special Constables. That should help Wixams.

Crime report

In the first seven days of May there have been 5 Theft From Motor Vehicle offences reported in Elstow, Shortstown and Wilstead. In these offences the police say they can see that property has been left in the vehicle and on display. The police urge residents to follow crime prevention advice-see page one for details. The crime report is provided by Bedfordshire Police with volunteer help from Bedford & District Neighbourhood Watch. The increase in reported crime means that we have had to leave out some small adverts.

Crimes that are: Sexual, Blackmail, breach of any type of police order, Race or religious hate, Domestic violence, are now included in the crime figures, but with specific locations removed. In the Wilstead/Wixams area the following incidents were recorded. In March: domestic violence - 4; hate crime - 1. In April: domestic violence - 4; sexual crime - 2.

Reporting to Wixams - May 2017

Bedford's 'Local Plan 2035' is currently out for consultation. This is the Mayor's proposal for future housebuilding and development across the Borough.

In Wixams we are no strangers to development as many of us have been living on a building site for years, knowing that there is yet more to come.

Part of the plan takes four 'Tier 1' villages and proposes that 500 houses should be built in each. One of these Tier 1 villages is our neighbour, Wilstead, which currently has just over 1000 dwellings, so an increase of 500 would grow Wilstead by an astonishing 50%. This will fundamentally change the character of Wilstead and – importantly for us – is likely to create a large development sprawl from Wixams across to Shortstown, taking ever more of our green space.

Many Bedford villages are calling for small scale development, to accommodate incremental growth, but they have been ignored as the Mayor has gone for the sledgehammer approach of 500 houses across just 4 small villages, which will change their character beyond recognition.

We know there is a chronic need for more houses, particularly to get younger people on the housing ladder, but destroying Bedford's villages with over the top growth targets is not the answer.

I have already made my opposition to the draft Local Plan 2035 clear and I encourage Wixams residents to take a look at the proposals on the Council's website and send in their comments by the deadline of 9th June.


