Lifebags

We have purchased two inflatable rescue lifebags as promoted by Bedford Fire Service: one for Dane Lane lake and one for the lake next to Budgens. These should be installed over the next few months. The lifebags are stored in a coded box; the code can be obtained by calling 999.



Security

We continue to look for quotes to improve CCTV provision. In addition, we are investigating the costs of providing a part time mobile security patrol for Wixams. I hadn't expected it to be so difficult to get security companies to quote for work, so would welcome contact from companies with an active interest in quoting...

Speeding

The council is investigating potential solutions to speeding in Wixams with Chris Pettifer (Head of Transport Operations Bedford Borough Council). Borough Highways have already added us to the waiting list for average speed cameras for when the next pot of funding is allocated, should we wish to take this up.

This action is based on the results from the speed recording data boxes that were placed by the police on Bedford Road in September, which evidenced that the road has a speed problem. The police have confirmed they will be carrying out manned speed checks, but do not see this as a permanent solution.

Grants

We are extending our grant funding from £5,000 to £10,000 each year to fund local groups. To apply for a grant you must be a charity, community group or local voluntary organisation with a dedicated bank account, operating or providing a service to the community of Wixams.

The Council defines a voluntary group as a not-for-profit organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee. Grants can be offered on a one-off basis to support a particular project or the purchase of equipment, to new groups wishing to start up, or as a contribution towards running costs. Please contact the Clerk for further details.

Parish Action Plan

We are acting on feedback gathered as part of the Parish Action Plan: to start with, ensuring borough council waste bins are being regularly emptied, adding new bins and targeting littering hotspots.

Bedford Neighbourhood Watch has joined forces with the England Illegal Money Lending Team (IMLT) to raise awareness of loan sharks and where help can be found.

e

The IMLT is a government agency set

up in 2004 that investigates and prosecutes loan sharks whilst providing support to victims and communities under the control of illegal money lenders.

Unlicensed illegal money lenders, or "loan sharks" as they are more commonly known, target individuals, charging exorbitant rates of interest and using fear and intimidation to recover monies 'owed'.

The team have secured more than 380 prosecutions for loan sharks, leading to nearly 330 years' worth of custodial sentences. £74,000.000 of illegal debt has been written off with over 28,000 people helped. Residents are encouraged to contact the IMLT if they have been the victim of a loan shark and advised of alternative affordable lending options.

How do I know if I'm a victim? If you can answer yes to one or more of these questions you might be borrowing from a loan shark:

- Did they offer you a cash loan without any paperwork?
- Did they add huge amounts of interest or APR to your loan?
- Have they threatened you?
- Are you scared of people finding out?
- Have they taken your bank card, post office card, passport, watch or other valuables from you?

You are not in trouble if you have borrowed cash or have been paying back a loan from an illegal money lender, the loan shark is. They are the people committing a crime, not you.

Reporting to Wixams November 2018

1. Covanta incinerator

At the October meeting of Bedford Council, I proposed a motion on Covanta which requested:

- $\hfill \Box$ Bedford Borough Council provides financial support to BACI in relation to the Judicial Review
- ☐ That the Borough Council commits not to use the incinerator should it proceed and that it will seek to persuade other Councils not to use it either.

This is an important issue for Wixams residents and I therefore felt it appropriate that the Council should agree to these proposals.

After much discussion, these points were ultimately approved and the Mayor agreed a £500 contribution to BACI at the meeting.

Sadly, the legal challenge by BACI has just been dismissed. What we now need regarding Covanta is concrete, forward thinking action to prevent the incinerator from going ahead. Ultimately, weakening the business case for the incinerator, by refusing to use it and getting others to agree the same, is what will defeat Covanta.

2. A6 - temporary speed restrictions and repairs

Also in October, £2.75m was set aside for resurfacing the A6 between Wilstead and Wixams. A stretch of the A6 has been subject to speed restrictions and temporary repairs, since problems were spotted after the heatwave.

The resurfacing project should provide a long term solution to the ongoing maintenance issues associated with this strategic route. The Wilstead Bypass section of the A6 carries approximately 19,000 vehicles per day. The resurfacing work is expected to take place during the next municipal year, 2019/20.




