

A lmost all drivers risk having cars stolen by criminals using hightech theft devices: Here are the simple steps to stop it happening to you



• Most drivers keep keys where they can be hacked by criminals

• Car security firm says two thirds of car thefts involved 'relay' attacks

• Keys can even be kept in the fridge to stop the signal being copied

Andy Barrs, head of police liaison at Tracker, said there are some simple precautions people can take to stop criminals from being able to tap into keys, though they might take some ingenious thinking.

He said: 'Whilst the relay devices can receive signals through walls, doors and windows, metal is its enemy, so putting keys in a metal tin or the microwave is a cost effective way to thwart the criminals.'



Andy adds: 'Alternatively, invest in a metallised signal blocking pouch, such as a Faraday wallet (\pounds 4.99 on Amazon), which is designed to shield electronic keys from relay attacks.'

Development in Wixams



The council would like to thank Stephen Sage (Project Director L&Q Estates, formerly Gallaghers) for attending the October Parish Council meeting to provide an update on development in Wixams.

This included confirmation that: The infrastructure for **Village 3** is being installed currently – completion by early 2020. The Town Centre (estimate start date early 2021) is due to contain a food store, pub, 10-15 retail units, a large sports facility and a primary school in Village 3. There may be a Medical Centre, although this is not yet definite.

A **pedestrian path and link road** between Village 2 and Village 4 will hopefully be opening in Spring 2020 off Green Lane.

The **Dementia Care Home** is still planned to go ahead. The land next to is has been sold to be used for industrial units/land.

Adoption by the Borough Council of multiple roads in Wixams is imminent; any blown streetlights will be fixed as part of this snagging process.

Benches

We are in the process of planning the installation of new benches around the lakes in Wixams – in various styles and locations. The proposal is on our website to allow residents to provide feedback. We'll then obtain permission for as many of the locations as possible. Please go to the Official Documents area of the website and look for the Benches folder.

Wixams Parish Council cont. Grants

Cyber crime -don't be a victim

To reduce your chances of becoming a victim to cyber crime:

• Use a strong password or passphrase, which is at least 12 characters long and contains a mixture of letters, numbers and symbols

• Never give personal or sensitive details out online or over email

• Make sure all devices have up-to-date antivirus software and a firewall installed

• Keep software and apps regularly updated only download from legal, trusted websites only open emails and attachments from known and trusted sources

• Look for the padlock icon in the address bar when paying for goods or services online – it means the website is trusted and secure

• Check the address starts with https:// whenever you're asked to enter sensitive information online

• Avoid using public WiFi hotspots that are not secure or ask you for personal information to access it

• Regularly back up your data

Control your social media accounts – regularly check your privacy settings and how your data is being used and shared
Be cautious of internet chats and online dating – there's no guarantee you're speaking to who you think

Reporting to Wixams November 2019

ast month I met with a Borough Highways Officer around Wixams. We looked at 6 different spots around Wixams where traffic problems have been raised by residents as a concern.

Inconsiderate parking and speeding traffic have been raised repeatedly at Wixams PC and Parish Councillors are determined to address this. Over a long period of time, residents have demanded action on the following:

• Parking cars on pavements, preventing pedestrians and those with child buggies and disability scooters from crossing

• Parking too close to road junctions, preventing cars from manoeuvring safely

• Cars not stopping at junctions, as the junctions are not clearly marked and white lines have worn away

• Speeding, particularly along Bedford Road, Green Lane and cars leaving the MUGA

The Parish Council and I are currently discussing the areas where most urgent action is needed. Once these have been agreed a report will be sent to the Borough Council, who will then launch a statutory 6-week consultation, where residents will be able to comment - for and against - what is proposed.

It's imperative that we address these traffic problems as quickly as possible before someone is injured or worse. We have successfully had yellow zig-zags and cameras put in place outside Lakeview School, and a number of tickets have been issued to those who continue to flout the parking rules.

The safety of local residents, of all ages, is extremely important to me. We cannot allow people to drive around like maniacs or park with complete disregard for others. Pavements are for pedestrians, roads are for traffic, to


