Station update



Bedford Council's Executive Committee has now formally agreed to bridge the funding gap on the Wixams Station

project and add to Gallagher's previously agreed contribution, in order for the project to move forward at long last.

Naturally, for a project of this size and scale, a long and complicated process to deliver the station now awaits us. The 40 Borough Councillors will now vote on the funding package and, if approved, a feasibility study will then get underway, to lay the groundwork for detailed cost estimates and an evaluation of the technicalities of the project.

In my regular monthly report inside, I have provided some 'key facts' that have come out of my discussions with Council officers during the last couple of weeks.

Silent Soldier



You will probably have noticed the Silent Soldier silhouette in the centre of Wixams. The Bedfordshire Royal British Legion 'Silent Soldier' marks the sacrifice of those who fell in the four years of war leading up to the Armistice in November 1918.

Nearly I.I million British and Empire service men and women were killed during the First World War before the guns finally fell silent on Armistice Day II November 1918; Bedfordshire RBL is keen to ensure that we in the county pay respects to those who gave so much.

The soldier references those who came home 'silently'.

A poppy wreath will be laid on behalf of Wixams Parish Council at the Wilstead Memorial on Sunday 11th Nov.

It goes without saying that the Parish Council was extremely disappointed to see that part of the soldier had been broken off soon after installation.

Grants

We are pleased to have recently provided a £1200 grant to Wixams 1st Scouts to cover camping equipment costs and £1100 to Lakeview Primary School PTA to cover the costs of 3 school laptops.

We have up to £5,000 of grants available each year to fund local groups. To apply for a grant you must be a charity, community group or local voluntary organisation with a dedicated bank account, operating or providing a service to the community of Wixams. The Council defines a voluntary group as a not-for-profit organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee.

Grants are usually offered on a oneoff basis to support a particular project, event, activity or the purchase of equipment. They are also open to new groups wishing to start up and receive a small contribution towards their running costs.

The Council particularly welcomes applications from small or newly formed groups and those that have not applied to us before. Please contact the Clerk for further details.

Speed Watch and Speeding

Two speed recording data boxes were placed by the police on Bedford Road in September. The first box was placed near to Watson Road and the second box was placed near Falcon Field.

The first box revealed that 55% of all traffic was travelling at 35mph or above (a prosecutable speed).

The second box revealed that 28% of all traffic was found to be travelling at 35mph or above. This evidences that the road has a speed problem. The police have confirmed they will be carrying out manned speed checks, but do not see this as a permanent solution, so we will be approaching the borough council to find out what can be done longer term.

The council is looking for volunteers to create a Speed Watch team to reduce speeding in Wixams. Speed Watch seeks to promote safer driving in our local communities by educating, rather than prosecuting individuals.

Having registered as a volunteer you will be offered a training course run by Bedfordshire Police.

The volunteers will then run the Speed Watch session noting details of any vehicles exceeding the speed limit. (Cont p2)

Reported crime

Crimes reported in Wixams

At the time of going to print the crime report for September was not available. It will be published in November's edition. The crime report is provided by Bedfordshire Police with volunteer help from Bedford & District Neighbourhood Watch. Because of IT changes street names are not available this month.

CCTV is in operation in the Wixams. Bedfordshire Police, in collaboration with Wixams Parish Council, are able to view footage if crimes have been committed. Note: the Police need a location and a time

Councillor GRAEME COOMBES Reporting to Wixams October 2018

I've recently had a series of meetings and discussions with the Mayor, Council Finance Officers and the person at Bedford Council now charged with responsibility for delivering Wixams Station and thought I'd let you have......

12 quick facts about the Wixams Station project

- 1. A funding package of £27m is being put together to cover the estimated costs of planning and construction for Wixams
- 2. Bedford Council's Executive has agreed to add £14m funding to Gallagher's £13.4m contribution
- 3. This funding package will be voted on by Councillors on 10th October 2018
- 4. £200k has been set aside to complete the next stage of the feasibility study
- 5. When it's built, Bedford Council will own the station via a 'Special Purpose Vehicle' (SPV)
- 6. It will be run and managed by a professional operating company, not the Council
- 7. It is estimated that up to 600,000 passengers a year could use Wixams Station
- 8. The business case for the station estimates the Council will be reimbursed over 40 years
- 9. Income will be produced via fares, a retail outlet and advertising
- 10. There will be a station car park, run by Bedford Council. (I have asked for a residents parking scheme to avoid parking problems for those living nearby)
- 11.It is estimated that the station will take 4 years from the initial feasibility study, through the planning and construction phase, until it is ready to operate.
- 12.If the project stays on schedule, Wixams station will be ready to operate in 2022


