If you are interested in becoming a councillor then please email the Clerk; it's an extremely easy application process. Meetings are once a month and occur in the evening. No prior experience is required.

Report on Wixams Station

The council would like to thank Chris Pettifer (BBC Head of Transport & Operations) for attending the September Parish Council meeting to provide an update on Wixams train station.

You can find full details in the September minutes on our website. In short, Chris is hoping to get the station to the design stage by Summer 2020 and then move on to the tender process, with the aim to have the station built by 2023. The business plan is strong and there is good industry support from the rail companies.

There is a dependency on the East West rail project - this will link Oxford to Cambridge via Bedford. There are five proposals for that route; two linking with Bedford Station and three linking with a new station south of Bedford potentially Wixams. The outcome of this decision would affect the station design; if the southern option goes ahead then a bigger station would be needed as it would be a crossover point. It is thought that the preferred route will be set out by the East West Rail Company and the Government this year. The final completion date for that project is 2028.

Chris stated that there is a huge commitment from all sides in BBC to get the Wixams station built and it's a standing item on their fortnightly Cont meetings.

Reporting to Wixams October 2019

In September, along with members from both Wixams and Wilstead Parish Councils, I had a meeting with representatives from the **Bedfordshire Clinical**Commissioning Group (BCCG) to discuss the ongoing delay with provision of a local health facility.

A **GP** service/health facility was one of the early pieces of infrastructure promised for Wixams that has never quite got off the ground, due to the inaction and lack of collaboration between the health commissioning organisations and Bedford Council. This has been incredibly frustrating, but thankfully Wilstead Parish Council (which used to cover Wixams) has been continuing to pursue the health commissioning groups to provide a facility at Wixams, since our first meeting with them back in 2011.

During the September meeting, we again pressed BCCG to provide us with concrete plans for delivery of a health service facility at the earliest opportunity. BCCG confirmed that they are now in discussion with the Planning Department at Bedford Council about a site for a health facility as part of what will become Wixams town centre. Although the Commissioners would not put anything in writing, they verbally indicated a willingness to push internally within BCCG for commissioning a Wixams facility by 2022. I have now requested Bedford Council Planning Department to meet us as well, to present their side of the case for a health facility and to discuss town centre plans in more detail. Like the station, this has been an incredibly long, drawn out process, but both the local Parish Councils and I will continue to press BCCG and Bedford Council for urgent delivery of a health centre at Wixams.


