The amount of police presence allocated to us is based on the level of reported crime; low crime statistics have been quoted back to the Parish Council in the past when requesting action for ASB by the lake area, although we did successfully secure a patrol this summer. Aside from resource allocation, it also provides useful information to the police. You should call 101 to report crime that does not require an emergency response.

Wixams Parish Council cont. Grants

We have grant funding of £10,000 each year to fund local groups.

To apply for a grant you must be a community group or local voluntary organisation with a dedicated bank account, operating or providing a service to the community of Wixams.

The Council defines a voluntary group as a not-for-profit organisation, set up and run by a voluntary, unpaid management committee. Grants can be offered on a one-off basis to support a particular project or the purchase of equipment, to new groups wishing to start up, or as a contribution towards running costs.

Areas of ownership

With such a high level of development in Wixams it can be hard to follow the ownership of roads, streetlights, grasscutting areas and bins - be it developer or Borough Council – and residents have in the past asked us for information. It's a work in progress and we are still reaching out to the Borough Council for more data. In all instances you can reach out to the Borough Council for maintenance issues and they will direct you.

Councillor GRAEME COOMBES Reporting to Wixams September 2019

The Borough Council is currently running a consultation on Bedford Town Centre. Bedford residents have frequently expressed concern about the current state of the town centre, both as a shopping centre and a place to visit. Whilst the town has a lot to offer, there are a number of issues that need to be addressed.

There is a serious need for new thinking, to address the ongoing drop in footfall and the closure of a number of significant retailers, including Marks & Spencer. The nature of our town centres is changing as more and more of us shop online, or at retail parks. To date there has been a woeful lack of urgency from the Council in addressing this issue in Bedford, with too much focus on the controversial Riverside North development and the installation of the new footbridge. However, Bedford Council has belatedly decided to address the issue, with the creation of a Cabinet position with specific responsibility for the town centre. In addition, the Council is currently running a public consultation, to get your thoughts and find out what would make you go into the town centre more often.

I would encourage residents to respond to the Council's consultation, to have your say on what you want to see for Bedford Town Centre. The survey is open until Friday 27 September 2019 and is available online on the Borough Council website: <u>https://forms.bedford.gov.uk/TCS/</u>


